1. Adopting agency: Alaska Workers' Compensation Board
2. General subject of regulation: Workers' compensation medical fee schedules.
3. Citation of regulation: 8 AAC 45.082, 8 AAC 45.083, and 8 AAC 45.900.
4. Department of Law file number: JU2015200907
5. Reason for the proposed action: Compliance with state statutes, Chapter 63, SLA 2014 and Chapter 31, SLA 2015.
6. Appropriation/Allocation: Workers' Compensation – #344.
7. Estimated costs in the aggregate to comply with the proposed action to:

a. Private Persons:

The Department of Labor and Workforce Development and the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board anticipates that complying with the regulations will not increase costs to private persons. The proposed medical fee schedules are anticipated to lower payments made to healthcare providers who treat workers' compensation claimants. If medical costs decrease, it is anticipated that will help reduce workers' compensation insurance premium rates paid by employers.

b. Other State Agencies:

The Department of Labor and Workforce Development and the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board anticipates that complying with the regulations will not increase costs to other State agencies. The State of Alaska is self-insured for workers' compensation. Lower workers' compensation medical costs will benefit the State of Alaska as an employer.

c. Municipalities:

The Department of Labor and Workforce Development and the Alaska Workers' Compensation Board anticipates that complying with the regulations will not increase costs to municipalities. As employers, lower workers' compensation medical costs will benefit municipalities.
