Pipeline Training

Work in Alaska's oil patch is increasing as companies invest in bringing more oil to market. New projects are providing hundreds of new construction and oil field support jobs and the industry needs workers trained to fill those positions. Each year Alaska Works Partnership and Alaska's four pipeline unions—

Operating Engineers Local 302, Laborers Local 942 and 341, Plumbers and Pipefitters Local

375, and Teamsters Local 959 – along with the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development and Alaska contractors host a Joint Pipeline Training event in Fairbanks.

The event gives trainees an opportunity to hone specific skills and coordinate efforts with other workers on the pipeline.

By training apprentices, unions are preparing a new generation of pipeline workers. The Alaska Gas Pipeline project alone will need 7,000 skilled pipeline trade workers during an estimated three-year construction period.

2005 Training Highlights

35% of participants were from rural Alaska.

13 % of participants were women.

Training included 97 trainees and 19 instructors from four trade unions.

Most trainees went to work immediately following their pipeline training.
