Event Provides Hands-on Career and Technical Education Experience for Alaska Students

JUNEAU, Alaska—The Alaska Departments of Labor and Workforce Development and Transportation and Public Facilities and are again joining forces to provide career and technical education opportunities for students at the third annual Construction Career Days April 21 at the Alaska State Fairgrounds in Palmer.
