Alaska Veterans Job Fair Nov. 2 in Anchorage; Virtual Hiring Event Nov. 2-16

JUNEAU, Alaska—More than 135 employers, education, training and apprenticeship providers are expected at the Alaska Veterans Job Fair, "Hiring Our Heroes," on Wednesday, Nov. 2 at 10 a.m. at the University Center in Anchorage.
