Unemployment Insurance Program January-December 2019

UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

- Total Alaskan seasonally adjusted labor force was 351,753.
- Total number of people receiving an Unemployment Insurance (UI) payment for at least one week was 28,781.
- Average weekly amount paid out to claimants was \$251.
- Statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment rate averaged 6.3 percent — lowest in November and December at 6.1 percent and highest in January through April at 6.5 percent.
- The UI program collected \$1,558,763 in overpaid benefits from fraudulent claims, \$864,901 in penalties from fraud and \$1,376,368 in other overpaid benefits.
- Total benefit dollars paid for this period was \$83,451,376.
- Largest daily UI payout was \$1,677,428, paid on Jan. 22, 2019.
- 98 percent of clients used automated systems to file their biweekly claims.

- Claim centers responded to 107,524 phone calls from claimants.

TAX

- 18,698 employers were registered in Alaska.
- 69 percent of registered employers had fewer than 10 employees.
- More than 73,080 Contribution Reports were processed.
- More than 1,513,950 quarterly wage records were added to the wage file.
- \$110,526,000 was deposited in the UI Tax Trust Account.
- \$20,866,130 was collected and deposited into the accounts of the State Training and Employment Program Account and the Alaska Technical and Vocational Education Program.
- \$4,540,871 was refunded to Alaska employers who overpaid their taxes.
