Unemployment Insurance Program January-December 2020

UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

- Total Alaskan seasonally adjusted labor force was 342,406.
- Total number of people receiving an Unemployment Insurance (UI) payment for at least one week was 87,288 (does not include Pandemic Unemployment Assistance).
- Average weekly amount paid out to claimants was \$843 (includes Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation \$600 weekly supplement).
- Statewide seasonally adjusted unemployment rate averaged 8.5 percent — lowest in March at 5.2 percent and highest in April at 13.5 percent.
- The UI program collected \$1,659,391 in overpaid benefits from fraudulent claims, \$599,223 in penalties from fraud and \$3,278,430 in other overpaid benefits.
- Total benefit dollars paid for this period was \$935,489,498.
- Largest daily UI payout was \$29,311,850, paid on April 27, 2020.

- 99 percent of clients used automated systems to file their weekly claims.
- Claim centers responded to 359,237 phone calls from claimants.

TAX

- 19,483 employers were registered in Alaska.
- 74 percent of registered employers had fewer than 10 employees.
- More than 72,660 Contribution Reports were processed.
- More than 1,319,819 quarterly wage records were added to the wage file.
- \$111,704,700 was deposited in the UI Trust Fund Account.
- \$20,141,355 was collected and deposited into the accounts of the State Training and Employment Program Account and the Alaska Technical and Vocational Education Program.
- More than \$3,952,000 was refunded to Alaska employers who overpaid their taxes.
