## What are "improper" payments?

An improper payment of Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits means that a claim for benefits was paid in error.

An improper payment of benefits can result when inaccurate information is provided by the claimant or employer, or when information is not received by the state UI office in a timely manner.

Once an improper payment is identified, the claimant is notified of an "overpayment" and contacted by Employment Security Division's Benefit Payment Control unit for repayment.

### **Prevention**

You can be an active partner with UI to improve payment accuracy by following these steps:



weeks of partial unemployment. Failure to respond to a request for verification of earnings can result in an improper payment of UI benefits.

## • Provide complete Employee Separation Information.

You are encouraged to provide employee separation information either by phone or by completing a questionnaire provided by the UI claim center by the specified due date. Employer information is important in determining the claimant's eligibility for UI benefits.



## Your cooperation is critical

When your former employees file for UI benefits, often the information they provide us is inaccurate or incomplete. This can cause improper payment of benefits. You can help reduce improper payments and potentially higher tax rates by timely submitting a complete and accurate:

- Alaska New Hire Reporting form
- Voluntary leaving or Discharge statement
- New Hire Audit
- Quarterly Contribution Report
- Wage/Earnings Audit
