ORDER AND DECISION NO. 48 PERTAINING
TO UNIT CLARIFICATION NO. 78-6, FILED
BY ALASKA PUBLIC SERVICES EMPLOYEES,
LOCAL 71 REGARDING A SUPPLY CLERK AT
THE SEWARD SKILL CENTER

On September 25, 1978, Alaska Public Employees, Local 71 submitted a unit clarification petition (UC 78-6). In the petition, Local 71 contended that an employee at the Seward Skill Center presently occupying a position classified as a Clerk II was in reality performing duties of a Partsman Wage Group IV. Local 71 requested that the position be transferred from the General Government Unit to the Labor Trades and Crafts Unit, represented by Local 71.

FINDINGS OF FACT

A hearing on the petition was held on February 19 and 20, 1979. After consideration of the testimony at the hearing and the documentary evidence submitted by the parties, the Alaska Labor Relations Agency finds that the incumbent of the position, which is the subject of the petition filed by Local 71, is performing duties which are not entirely those of a Clerk II or those of a Partsman IV.

CONCLUSION

The Alaska Labor Relations Agency concludes that the petitioner has not provided sufficient evidence to justify a determination that the employee should be transferred to a different bargaining unit.

ORDER AND DECISION NO. 48

The Alaska Labor Relations Agency orders that the petition UC 78-6 filed by the Public Employees Local 71, is denied.
