Subject: **29 CFR 1904 and 1952 Occupational Injury and Illness recording and Reporting Requirements; Final Rule**

This Program Directive, PD 01-08, adopts by reference and will implement the changes to *29 CFR Parts 1904 and 1952 Occupational Injury and Illness Recording and Reporting requirements; Final Rule*. This provides revisions to the rule addressing recording and reporting of occupational injuries and illnesses, including the forms employers use to record those injuries and illnesses. Following a review pursuant to White House Chief of Staff Andrew Card's January memorandum, the agency has determined that all but a few of the provisions shall take effect as scheduled. Please review the proposals on hearing loss and musculoskeletal disorders outlined in 66 FR 128 pp 35113-35115.

This program directive becomes effective Jan 1, 2002. Please ensure that all members of your staff receive both 29 CFR 1904 & 1952, and this program directive, and understand how to implement it.
