Why Use Consultation and Training Services?

All consultation visits and most trainings are **FREE**; smaller employers receive priority services.

<u>Consultants DO NOT issue citations or penalties.</u>

Employers can request on-site visits and training to fit specific needs of their company by completing a *Request Form* to specify which services are needed.

Benefits of C&T Services

Save Money

A strong workplace safety and health program makes "good business sense" and yields major returns on your investment. Each avoided workplace injury saves approximately \$8,500. Reducing Worker's Compensation claims will help keep premiums and injury and illness rates low.

Engage Your Workforce

An effective safety and health program at your worksite will put your workers in a better position to become more effective at their jobs, increase productivity rates, and assure product quality.

Confidential

Consultation services are kept confidential from the AKOSH Enforcement section. Consultants are prohibited from disclosing information to Enforcement Officers while working with an employer.

Types of AKOSH Training

Site-Specific Training

Employers may request site-specific training on various topics such as fall protection, accident prevention, personal protective equipment, bloodborne pathogens program, scaffolding, monitoring, and other OSHA-regulated training.

OSHA 10-Hour General Industry or Construction

AKOSH provides OSHA 10-Hour training in Construction and General Industry for employers throughout Alaska. This two-day course is offered to employers who require certification for their staff in Construction or General Industry. A minimum of ten employees are required to attend.

Workplace Violence Training (WPV)

This training covers basic WPV prevention techniques and addresses concerns regarding the safety and protection of employees in case of a WPV event. Additional WPV topics include:

- Customer Service De-escalation Techniques
- Bully Prevention Awareness
- Preventing Hostile Work Environments

Seafood Training

AKOSH offers employers a free, two-day seafood training session for supervisors and management personnel in the seafood industry.

What Employers can Expect from a Visit

Many hazards identified during the visit may be corrected on-site. Employers can make corrective actions during the visit. Having supervisors and key personnel readily available during the visit is an excellent way to get things done.

If serious hazards cannot be corrected during the consultation visit, consultants can help the employer develop a plan for corrections with specific target dates (typically within 60 days) from the date of the visit. Short-term interim protective measures may be necessary.

Following the consultation visit, the employer will receive a **confidential** written report that details the consultant's findings. The report includes recommendations for hazard corrections and other supporting materials. If more time is needed to correct a hazard, the employer can submit a request for an extension.

Partnerships

Alaska Partnership Programs provide an opportunity for diverse employers to work cooperatively with AKOSH to improve workplace safety and health performance. Acceptance into a partnership is an achievement that will require significant ongoing efforts. The goals of partnership are varied and may include:

- Reduce accidents and related costs
- Increase productivity with less downtime and improved employee morale
- Improved industry focus on causes of workplace accidents
- Reduced Worker's Compensation costs and reportable injuries.

AKOSH has three Cooperative Programs:

- Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program (SHARP)
- 2. Voluntary Protection Program (VPP)
- Construction Health and Safety Excellence Program (CHASE)

Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program (SHARP)

SHARP is an exemption and recognition program that recognizes the safety and health practices of small employers that operate an exemplary safety and health program. Acceptance into SHARP is an achievement that demonstrates the employer is a role model for other business peers.

Benefits of SHARP

SHARP sites lead the way by example and inspire positive and creative change throughout their industries. Participants engage in conscientious hazard reporting and correction. SHARP participants emphasize positive worker involvement in safety and health activities. Benefits include:

- Reduced accidents and related costs
- Increased productivity with less down-time
- Improved safety culture and employee morale
- Collaboration with other SHARP members on safety and health topics

SHARP Participation (Getting Started)

- Receive a cost-free full-service Safety and Health Consultation visit with a comprehensive review of safety and health management systems.
- Implement and maintain a safety and health management system that meets or exceeds OSHA's guidelines.
- 3. Injury and illness rates do not exceed the national average for the company's industry.
- 4. Notify Consultation when changes in working conditions or work processes may introduce new hazards into the workplace.

Voluntary Protection Program (VPP)

Voluntary Protection Programs (VPP) promote effective worksite-based safety and health performance. In VPP, management, labor, and AKOSH establish cooperative relationships to implement a comprehensive safety and health management system. Approval in VPP provides official recognition of the outstanding efforts of employers and employees who have achieved exemplary occupational safety and health.

Getting Started

- The first step toward VPP is to establish a strong safety & health program.
- Schedule cost-free assistance through AKOSH C&T. A consultant will review your operations and provide guidance.

- Maintain safety and health management system excellence
- Maintain a cooperative relationship with AKOSH C&T
- Maintain employee support for VPP participation
- Maintain compliance with OSHA regulations and work toward industry best-practices
- Commit to continuous improvement.
- Conduct outreach and mentorship to promote safety and health excellence with industry peers.

Construction Health and Safety Excellence Program (CHASE)

In Alaska, construction presents unique safety and health challenges compared to almost any other industry. Construction companies in Alaska experience an extremely high rate of injuries. Construction is a high hazard industry and consequences of workplace injuries are often catastrophic.

CHASE was created to provide a partnership between licensed Alaska contractors and AKOSH to take a proactive approach in reducing these injuries, illnesses and fatalities within the construction industry in our great state.

How does CHASE work?

Through an established and structured approach, consultants work with contractors within the parameters of the program's guidelines. There are three levels of participation:

- AK Blue
- AK Gold
- AK-Flag

CHASE participants enter the program at the AK-Blue or AK-Gold level for a period of five years, after which they may qualify for AK-Flag status.

Benefits of CHASE

- This exciting partnership program tailored exclusively for the construction industry in Alaska produces immediate positive effects within the safety and health program through on-site training and hazard identification.
- Continued involvement between Consultation and the employer ensures established improvement measures are met and contractors strive toward the next level
- Proactive measures are established to ensure self-monitoring protocols are implemented and maintained to reduce and eliminate injuries and illnesses within the company workforce.
